 A webinar is being brought together to discuss how the range of causes of staff absence amongst NHS staff, and how NHS leaders might support them.

 The RPS Inclusion and Diversity strategy, highlighted being a parent and carer as one of the key barriers to working in pharmacy requiring more support and improvement, individuals also felt that pregnancy and maternity status was a barrier to working in the profession. This document considers microaggressions from pregnancy including difficulties in pregnancy through to being a parent or carer and onwards.
