Hospital admissions for flu overtook those for Covid this past winter

In this chart of the week, Sophie Julian takes a look at how hospital admissions for Covid-19 and flu have changed in recent years, and reveals how this past winter saw the number of hospital admission for flu overtake those for Covid-19 for the first time during the pandemic.

- Quality and Outcomes Framework (QOF) guidance for 2023/24 NHSE
 This document provides additional guidance on the interpretation and verification of the QOF indicators for 2023/24 in England. It is effective from 1 April 2023 and replaces versions issued in previous years.
- Wound Care Standard PRSB

This standard defines the information record content for the management of wound care. It is designed to support the professionals and those providing care as well as the person themselves, and to support the national wound care strategy. It has 3 specific domains which cover the wound care standard.
