#### **Quality and Safety**

- Penicillin allergy checklist SPS
  - This guide will help pharmacists and other healthcare professionals to diagnose if a patient is allergic to penicillin or not.
- NICE updates guidance to incorporate NHS England's standard on faster diagnosis of cancer NICE
  - This guideline covers identifying children, young people and adults with symptoms that could be caused by cancer.
- The Care Quality Commission (Maternity and Newborn Safety Investigation Programme) Directions 2023 DHSC
   These directions require the Care Quality Commission to exercise the functions set out in this direction from 1 October 2023.
- Maternity and Newborn Safety Investigation programme now hosted by CQC CQC
  - From 1 October 2023, the Maternity and Newborn Safety Investigations (MNSI) programme is being hosted by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).
- <u>Professional standards: framework for quality assurance and improvement NHSE</u>
  - Key parameters to assure the NHS England national responsible officer, and in turn the NHS England Board, that relevant statutory obligations are being met and quality improvements supported, as well as other key aspects of NHS England to enhance patient care through high professional standards.
- MBRRACE-UK Saving Lives Improving Mothers' Care Lessons learned to inform maternity care from the UK and Ireland Confidential Enquiries into Maternal Deaths and Morbidity 2019-21 NPEU
  - This report includes surveillance data on women who died during or up to one year after pregnancy between 2019 and 2021 in the UK. In addition, it also includes confidential enquiries into the care of women who died between 2019 and 2021 in the UK and Ireland from obstetric haemorrhage, amniotic fluid embolism, anaesthetic causes, infection, general medical and surgical disorders and epilepsy and stroke.



 New awareness campaign to help reduce hospital admissions for urinary tract infections NHSE

The NHS and UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) are raising awareness of urinary tract infections (UTIs), as new data shows they have led to more than 800,000 admissions to hospitals across the country over the past five years.
