   The 2024/25 priorities and operational planning guidance focuses on the recovery of our core services through continuous improvement in access, quality, and productivity, whilst transforming the way we deliver care and create stronger foundations for delivery in the future.

On 27 March 2024, NHS England (NHSE) published the 2024/25 priorities and operational planning guidance. In line with the 2023/24 guidance, the most immediate priority continues to be the recovery of core services and productivity following the pandemic, while making further improvements to access, quality and safety. The long-term ambition remains to transform the NHS to be fit for the future and to improve population health more broadly.
