Is there a quick route to reducing health care costs or visits to A&E?

A recent US study showed one simple intervention resulted in 27% fewer visits to emergency services. Could it work in the UK too?

The Royal College of Emergency Medicine is warning that fractional improvements to some "dismal" A&E performance metrics should not mask the "worryingly high" number of people waiting for over 12 hours on trolleys. It is calling for urgent action after the latest Emergency Department (ED) performance figures published by NHS England for November 2025 showed that 12-hour 'trolley waits' at their highest-ever levels for the month of November – a warning of what lies ahead in the depths of winter.
